I. Call to Order Paul Paradzinski
Paul Paradzinski called the meeting to order at 9:10 AM.

III. **Approval of Minutes – July 23, 2003** Paul Paradzinski
There were no objections raised to the minutes of the July 23, 2003 meeting. Minutes will be filed as presented.

IV. Contractor's Report – Goodwill Industries Wanda Anthony
Area 3 Youth Coordinator, Wanda Anthony presented a report on WIA Youth Activities performed by Goodwill. The recertification of previously registered participants is nearly complete. Goodwill has joined the Truancy Team in Franklin County, and has coordinated a Truancy team in Alleghany County. Tutoring and Mentoring partnerships have been developed through partnership with Ferrum College and Hollins University. Since the last meeting, Goodwill has added two participants in Franklin County and six in Alleghany. The truancy teams are a portion of Goodwill's overall youth program. Goodwill applied for the additional grant through the recent RFP to enhance their ability to place emphasis on truant youth and to do more for them.

Wanda reported that there were over 200 participants registered under WIA 3 in the system. A number of them had been in the system since 2000, 144 of which had no activity reported since last summer. As a result of Goodwill's research, they were able to determine that 105 of these
